Aims

This course equips students with essential, research-oriented skills to support the preparation of their research proposal and thesis in applied linguistics. In particular, it trains them to locate, evaluate, synthesize, and manage scholarly literature using Scopus and Web of Science (WOS). Additionally, students will become familiarized with how to identify and articulate original, defensible research gaps, and finally design and write clear, ethically sound research proposals and thesis sections/chapters. Emphasizing critical reading, academic writing, research planning, and scholarly practice, this course develops the competencies necessary for conducting rigorous MA-level research in applied linguistics.

Expectations

To ensure a productive and respectful learning environment, students are expected to:

- Attend all sessions punctually and remain for the full duration of class, except in cases of legitimate/documented reasons.
- Actively participate in discussions, workshops, and peer-review activities, contributing thoughtful insights and respectful feedback.
