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**Description** 

This course aims to strengthen and extend students' academic writing abilities beyond the

foundations established in the Advanced Writing course. It reinforces paragraph-level skills such

as unity, coherence, and effective support, while guiding students in transitioning from well-

structured paragraphs to full academic essays. The course further aims to develop students' ability

to integrate outside sources ethically through paraphrasing, summarizing, and proper citation.

Throughout the semester, students will apply the stages of the writing process to produce clear,

coherent, and well-organized texts across major essay types, including process, cause-and-effect,

comparison/contrast, and argumentative essays. Ultimately, the course seeks to build students'

confidence and independence as writers capable of producing extended academic texts with

accuracy, clarity, and critical thinking.

**Course requirements** 

1. Careful reading of the assigned materials and doing the exercises BEFORE each session

2. Active participation in *both* class and workshop sessions

3. Punctuality: Students who are absent in more than THREE sessions (or, in rare cases, 4 sessions)

will be automatically dropped from the course.

Writing assignments: 40%

Final examination: 50%
